	Main theme or storytelling part; often the narrative or thematic building blocks.	Repeated refrain or melody, the highlight or most memorable part, or the climax of tension and release. Transitional section connecting two different parts, often leading back to a verse or chorus, or reducing intensity after a climax.	Beginning of the track, setting the tone or mood.	The closing section of a track; it can be a fade out, a repeat of the chorus, or a final closing part.	Sections building anticipation to a main theme or chorus, creating tension, or serving as a prelude to a significant section of the composition.	Silence or effect-break to create tension, suspense or prepare for a radical change
